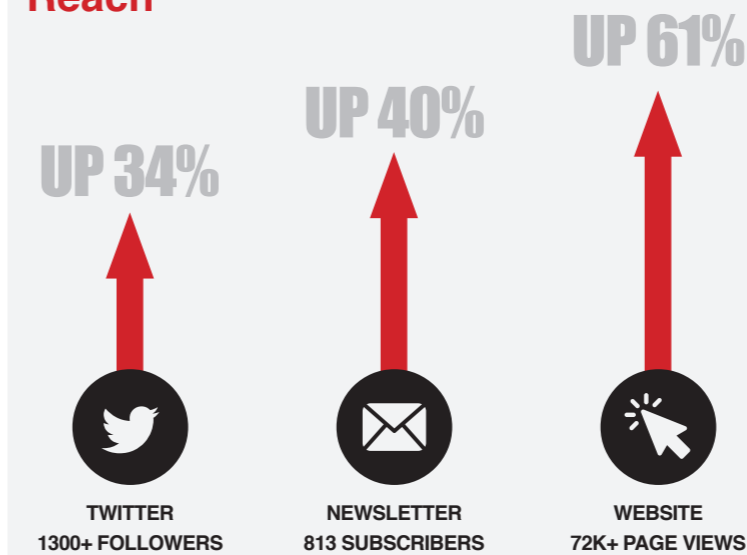

# Advocacy

**100%** OF WSA MEMBERSHIP FEES ARE SPENT ON ADVOCACY SUPPORT

Since our investment in dedicated advocacy and communications support, the collective voice of our members has gone from strength to strength. Our strategic advocacy aims are to raise awareness with political decision makers of the work of the sport and active recreation sector, and the wider societal and health benefits that sport can bring to all communities in Wales; and to demonstrate to industry that the sport and active recreation sector is open for business and is proactively seeking progressive solutions through collaboration and partnership.

We have created a WSA Advocacy & Policy Group to help position and support our consultation responses. In March, Neil Ward, CEO of the Welsh Football Trust was elected by the membership to Chair this open group, which currently has around 20 participants. We welcome and encourage member engagement so that we can accurately reflect the broad views of the membership in our advocacy work. We have also introduced political monitoring for our members so that they are fully informed of the policy and legislative landscape.

## CONSULTATION AND REPRESENTATION

This year, we have responded to the Ministerial statement to the Independent Review of Sport Wales, and the National Assembly for Wales Health & Sport Committee Inquiry into Children and Young People's Physical Activity, where we were also invited to take part in a roundtable discussion. The Policy Group also developed a response for the Free Swimming Initiative Review, and are collating our response to the Vision for Sport in Wales consultation run by Sport Wales.

The WSA also provides secretariat support to the National Governing Body CEO Forum and has contributed to the establishment of the Equalities in Sport Network. We also play a leading role on the Safeguarding in Sport Group,

taking part in its strategic advocacy subgroup, and represent the Sport Sector on the Third Sector Partnership Council – with one in four volunteers doing so through sport, we are fighting the corner for the development of research to evidence the impact of the sport and active recreation sector in delivering wider public policy objectives. We have worked closely with Sport Wales to make the case for identification of measurement platforms capable of demonstrating social return on investment and will continue to lobby for wider recognition of the value of the sector's social and economic impact.

We held a drop-in session at the National Assembly in September 2017, where we met with AMs and their staff, including Ministers. We used this opportunity to highlight the key issues facing our members and to explain the evolving role of the WSA. Following the Autumn reshuffle, we also met with new Minister for Culture, Tourism & Sport, Lord Dafydd Elis Thomas AM to discuss our work to support the sector's resilience and advocate on its behalf.

## RESEARCH

As part of our ongoing commitment to help demonstrate the value and power of sport, we are working with Wales' leading academics to identify and signpost relevant research. We have also developed a pilot scheme with Cardiff University to bring together multi-disciplinary teams of students to provide research support for our members. This will look at three research topics initially, with a view to expansion upon successful completion of this initial phase.

# Resilience

Since 1972, public investment in sport in Wales, via Sport Wales, has led to considerable success. This well intentioned investment has, however, led to a dependency culture for many. With the shadow of austerity looming, and a remit from government under pressure to do more for less, we have developed a Growth and Resilience Programme in response to the challenge by Welsh Government to tackle the reliance of the sports sector on public funding.

The WSA Resilience Project Team, led by Chair Helen Humphrey and with support from Sport Wales, commissioned extensive feasibility studies and research. The subsequent programme outlines three key areas which could be developed to improve sector sustainability - business development; events; and fundraising.

It is an ambitious solution which utilises best practice from across other sectors both in the UK and across the world, to help develop the skills and implement the behaviour change necessary for the not-for-profit sports development sector in Wales to continue to become resilient and not reliant. This is not something that will happen overnight, and it will inevitably require an injection of funding at the outset to support the sporting organisations as they acquire new skills and diversify incomes.

We are disappointed that investment is yet to be committed to the programme, but are optimistic that government recognises, as it has in the arts and heritage sectors, the huge benefit to broadening the business skills of the sector and the impact this could have across all communities. The initial outlay for this investment is around 1% of the total Sport Wales annual budget. Given the imperative of a diminishing public purse, we have already begun this journey in developing services according to the identified needs of our members.

We took the opportunity to widen the story of the resilience journey of Welsh sport by partnering with Wales Week in London, the annual series of activities to celebrate and raise the profile of Wales. Now in its second year, the programme has gained great momentum and provided an ideal platform on which to extend the reach of our advocacy work among leading business executives and political stakeholders. The positive response among industry representatives to our discussions on improving business relationships surpassed all expectations, and the strength of the enthusiasm for getting involved with Welsh sport bodes well for future endeavours.

## BOARD RECRUITMENT SERVICE

By far the jewel in the crown of our resilience service has been our partnership with Acorn Executive Search in supporting members to be able to recruit high caliber non-executive board members with the specific skills required to fill gaps on their boards, which is fundamental in helping to develop the required strategic skills to aid sustainability.

# Building Capability

The collective leverage held by our members means that we can identify and negotiate significant savings on their behalf. As our membership numbers increase so will this power and the value of our shared service provision. We are committed to providing flexible solutions and are constantly seeking new opportunities for our members to enhance efficiencies and boost savings.

## SAFEGUARDING

Users of our online Disclosure and Barring Checking Service (DBS) are up by 67%. Safeguarding remains a key priority for the us and we continue to continue work in partnership with the NSPCC Child Protection in Sport Unit to make sport safer for children in Wales.

## ONLINE BILINGUAL CHECKING SYSTEM

To reflect our members' ongoing commitment to the Welsh language, we worked with Pontypridd based CBS to develop a bilingual DBS checking service, so that Welsh language safeguarding checks can be completed in days rather than weeks as can be done in English.

Launched in March 2018, the Welsh Government Minister for Lifelong Learning and Welsh Language, Eluned Morgan AM, said: "I am delighted that the WSA and CBS have developed this service for Welsh speaking volunteers across Wales. This is the sort of proactive service that needs to be provided in the community if we are to truly foster a bilingual nation. Given the numbers of volunteers in Wales, it is vital that they are supported in practical ways, and this service will ensure

that clubs and organisations are able to keep participants safe in the language of their choice."

## ENHANCED SERVICES

We have continued to provide a broad range of shared services and regularly review them so that they stay relevant. We've added new titles to our training courses and joined up with insurance experts Integro and Sportscover to develop a unique online insurance product designed specifically for coaches in Wales, providing an instant quote for their comprehensive cover: <https://wsa.sportscover.com/>

## SPORT SAFETY GRANTS

The WSA has again supported the distribution of £10,000 of funding to support outdoor organisations providing vital lifesaving services for those undertaking recreational activities in our natural environment.

As ambassadors for the sector, we must lead by example, and our work to continually improve our Governance processes is bearing fruit. The gender split on our Board is now 50:50, with both a female Chair and CEO, and we have made great strides in attracting board members with their fingers on the pulse of Welsh sport and business. Our latest board recruit is Simon Stockton, a former member of the Specialist Crime Squad at South Wales Police.

Speaking about his role, Welsh speaker Simon said "My former role in the criminal justice system and now with the Princes Trust means that I have firsthand experience of the positive impact that sport and physical activity can have in changing lives for the good. I'm looking forward to using these skills to help the WSA ensure its relevancy to the changing policy landscape of its members."

A Welsh speaker, his hands-on experience of working with young people from deprived areas to reengage with society is a fantastic asset in enhancing our understanding of the changing landscape for sport and the way that it will be accessed in the future.

As vocal proponents of developing resilience and not reliance, the WSA is living proof that capitalising on business development opportunities can lead to diversification of income and thus increased sustainability. We are determined to support our members to do the same and will explore every avenue available to ensure that they are equipped with the skills that are needed to thrive and not just survive.

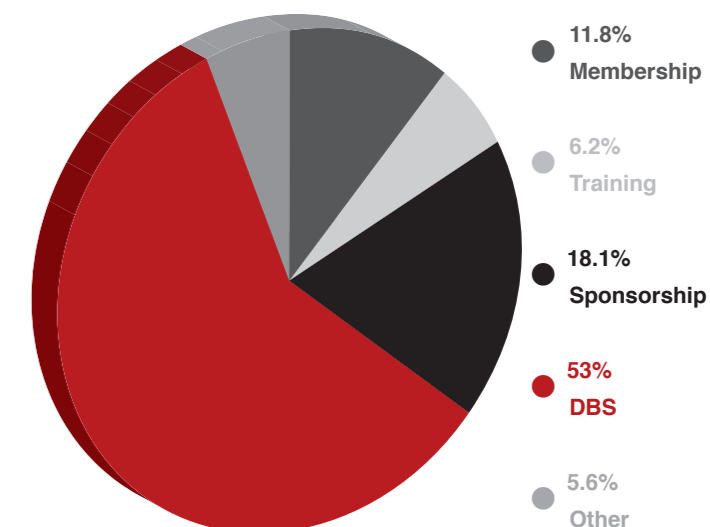
But these opportunities are not just based on cold hard cash. There is a need for wider recognition of the value of in kind services and partnerships such as the Acorn Executive Recruitment Service which has been worth £125K this year alone. While Treasure is always welcomed, the real value of the Time and Talent of expert volunteers cannot be understated. We will continue to push the use of metrics such as social return in demonstrating return on invest, so that the sector can leverage funding from new and diverse sources.

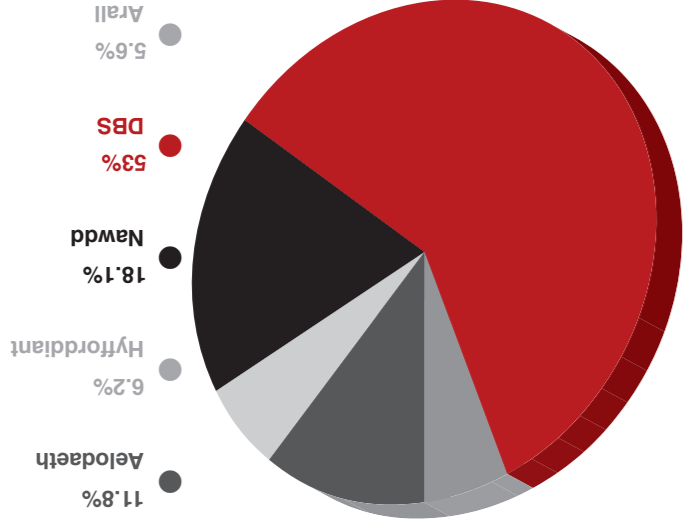

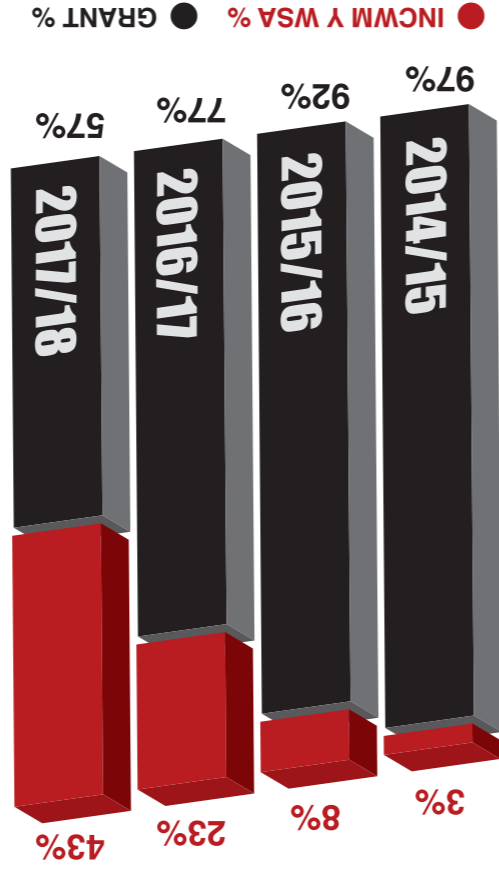

Ers 1972, mae'r buddsoddiad cyhoeddus mewn chwaraeon yng Nghymru, drwy gyfrwng Chwaraeon Cymru, wedi arwain at lwyddiant sylweddol. Fodd bynnag, mae'r buddsoddiad hwn, sy'n llawn bwrhad da, wedi arwain at ddiwylliant o ddibyniaeth i lawer. Gyda chysgod cyni ar y gorwel, a chych gwairh gan lywodraeth sydd dan bwysau i wneud mwy am lai, rydym wedi datblygu Rhaglen Twf a Chadernid fel ymateb i'r her gan Lywodraeth Cymru i fynd i'r atael â dibyniaeth y sector chwaraeon ar arian cyhoeddus.

Comisiynodd Tim Prosiect Cadernid y WSA, o dan arweinyddiaeth y Cadeirydd Helen Humphrey a gyda chefnogaeth gan Chwaraeon Cymru, astudiaethau dichonoldeb ac ymchwiliad. 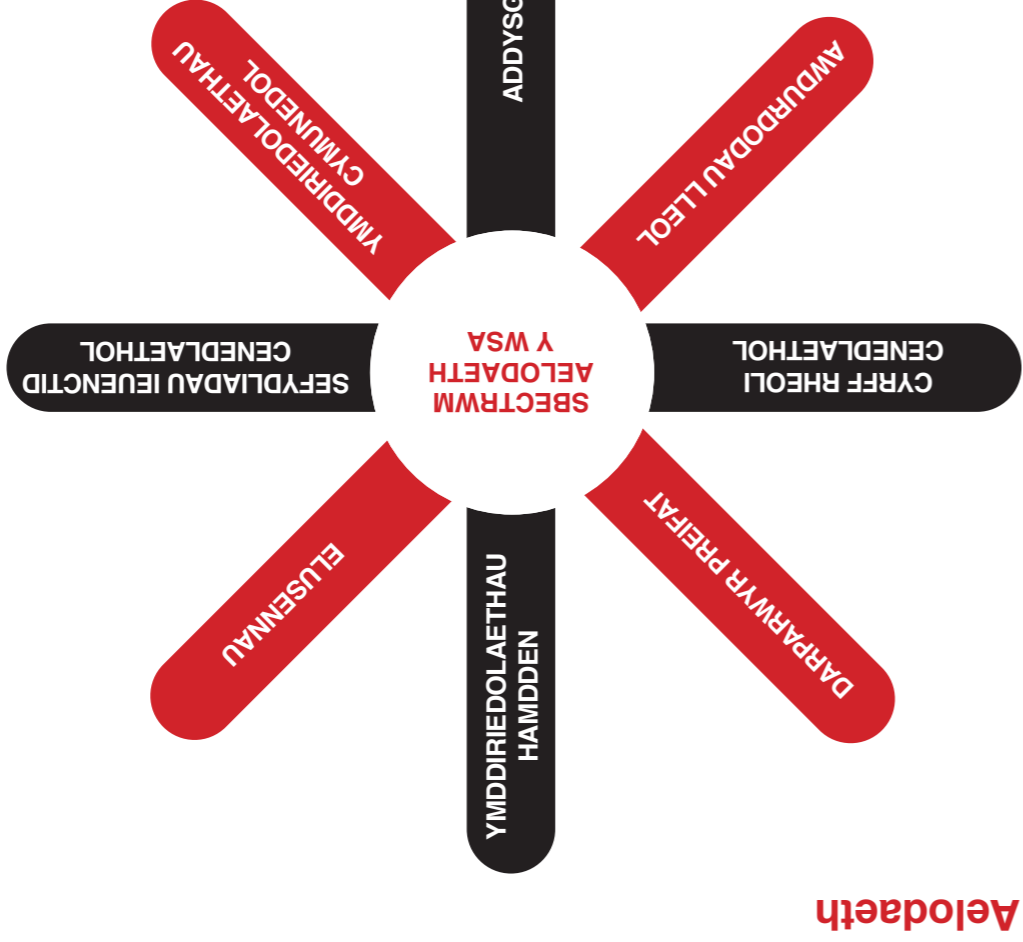
