Chair's Welcome



This has been another year of growth for the Welsh Sports Association (WSA). In my third year at the helm, our strategy is now in full swing, and we are working diligently towards our goal of helping to create a thriving and resilient sport and active recreation sector in Wales.

We are delighted that our own vision of “a Vibrant, Active Nation” has been recognised within the new Vision for Sport in Wales, launched in the summer of 2018 following a period of consultation across the country. Aligned to the Well-being of Future Generations Act (2015), it sets out the challenge for us all to contribute to:

“An active nation where everyone can have a lifelong enjoyment of sport”

To allow sport and active recreation organisations to be able to deliver this aspiration, and provide activity opportunities that are fun, safe and accessible to all, their foundations must be solidly in place. One of the fundamental purposes of the WSA is to provide the gateway to the professional support, training and development necessary to ensure financial and organisational sustainability for our members and their associated clubs.

This year, our focus has been on identifying those areas of support that have the greatest impact on improving efficiencies for our members, and so our expanded service offerings have concentrated on those which have digital platforms; which increase the ability to understand memberships and audiences; and which produce cost and capacity savings.

We continue to scan the business and legislative landscape to ensure our members are both aware of, and prepared for, the challenges ahead. With this in mind, and in line with our commitment to the Governance and Leadership Framework for Wales, we have recruited considerable expertise in these areas – Mark Tweed joins our Board as a Chartered Accountant with an excellent breadth of corporate finance experience.

Formerly UK Chief Financial Officer (CFO) for Opel Vauxhall Finance, he is now Group CFO and Head of Legal for Henry Howard Finance, based in Newport. Damian Phillips is the new Independent Chair of our Audit & Risk Committee. A Partner at Darwin Gray, he leads their sport division and has great experience of acting for a number of professional sportspeople and clubs on employment law issues. This is a crucial appointment for us as we continue to look to grow our business. Risk is something that we all need to understand and manage if it is not to become a barrier to our plans for growth and development.

As part of our programme of modernisation we identified that there was inequity among our membership structure, and so we are grateful to those governing body members who attended our General Meeting in March, who voted unanimously to amend our articles so that all not-for-profit members will receive voting rights, and therefore a voice, in shaping the future of the organisation. I am particularly pleased to have received this support from our members in recognition of how the WSA has evolved over recent years to reflect the breadth of the sector as, for personal reasons, I have taken the very difficult decision to stand down as Chair. I am immensely grateful to my Board colleagues for their understanding and delighted that they have given me the opportunity to continue to serve on the Board, which I have wholeheartedly accepted. I look forward to continuing to support the work of the WSA in aiding the sector's journey on the road to resilience.

Leading Advocacy

An independent, collective voice

Evidence

Championing and promoting the contribution of the sector to wider public policy issues continues to be at the forefront of our work. We warmly welcomed the publication of figures evidencing the social return on investment of sport and active recreation by Sheffield Hallam University, and this research will form the foundation of showcasing how sport and active recreation creates positive benefits well beyond improving the health and wellbeing of the nation.

Impact

Understanding and demonstrating impact continues to be an issue for our members, and with the likely move to an outcome-based public funding model in Wales, this has never been more important. We are working closely with the UK Sport for Development Coalition and Welsh Council for Voluntary Action to ensure that we are aware of and can share best practice, and so that opportunities to evidence our collective contribution are maximised.

To support this, we hope to join forces with both Sport Wales and Welsh Universities to develop a national bank of sports research to better signpost the evidence behind the successes that the sector delivers.

Engagement

The WSA met with both the Deputy Minister for Culture, Tourism and Sport and Minister for the Economy to explore how sporting organisations could be supported in terms of developing resilience. We have also continued our contact programme of meeting with backbench Assembly Members and key influencers.

Launch of the Welsh Sport Equality Alliance

Jointly funded by the WSA and Sport Wales, the Alliance has been established to help deliver the ambitions of the Vision for Sport in Wales and, recognising the need for improved collaboration, to bring Welsh equality partners in sport and the third sector together to assist the advancement of equality and diversity in sport in Wales.

Chaired by the Reverend Canon Aled Edwards OBE, the Alliance includes strategic expertise from equality organisations, and those who have an interest in working with sports sector representatives to further progress equality, diversity and inclusion in the physical activity of the nation.

The aim of the Alliance will be to signpost good practice and help to focus on delivering inclusion through partnerships; education and training; research, insights and policy; and workforce diversity.

Strategic Safeguarding in Sport Group

We continue to play a leading role within the National Safeguarding in Sport Group, particularly with the development of an advocacy subgroup to ensure that our key messages reach, and are ultimately understood by, our key stakeholders and influencers. In early 2019, we held a session to identify priorities ahead of manifesto planning for the National Assembly elections in 2021, and we will be targeting our campaigning around legal loopholes in terms of positions of trust, embedding safeguarding requirements within procurement criteria and expanding our networks.



Building Capability

Professional support, training & development

Overview

This has been a year of consolidation for our training provision as we have focused on improving efficiencies; aligning our training courses to reflect member needs; and reducing overheads to ensure that our members are getting value for money.

We have also looked at our environmental impact, concentrating on reducing waste and understanding the impact of our carbon footprint. Moving forward, we are considering our online presence in terms of promotion, payment and e-learning so that there are no barriers to accessing our training across Wales.

GDPR

The WSA joined forces with the GDPR Alliance for Wales to bring members additional support to help on their journey to becoming fully compliant with GDPR. A total of 178 participants have been trained across 23 members organisations that opted to take up the opportunity of support via the WSA. We encourage GDPR compliance to remain an on-going organisational effort to ensure robust businesses moving forward.

Safeguarding

We continue to offer the breadth of safeguarding training including Safeguarding and Protecting Children, Online Renewal and Time to Listen courses. We have worked specifically with senior Safeguarding leads to develop our supporting templates, for example, creating a document which suggests the best practice for responding to child protection issues, complaints or allegations within a sporting setting.

Public Affairs Training

At the request of members, we have launched a short "Introduction to Welsh Politics" training course and so far more than 30 people have attended sessions, with some organisations requesting bespoke training. The course has received very positive feedback, and so to expand on this we will introduce an additional more interactive course during the next year, which will include a visit to the Senedd and a Question & Answer session with opposition spokespeople and senior researchers.

Resilience

Our Road to Resilience symposium was well attended with over 90 people from across the sector taking part in interactive panel sessions with experts across fundraising, sponsoring and business development. With our legal partner Geldards, we also held training on Legal Structures for Organisations, and presented at the Welsh Council for Voluntary Action on the organisational and financial benefits of shared services.

Board Recruitment

Our partnership with Acorn Executive Search continues to flourish with 23 of our members having used the pro-bono service for the recruitment of around 45 Non- Executive Directors (NEDs) for their respective Boards, and some that have used the discounted service provided by Acorn for their 'paid' roles. Given that some bodies have recruited multiple NEDs and including the discounted service, the total savings to the WSA members is in the region of £230,000 for this financial year.

Developing Resilience

Financial & organisational sustainability

Overview

With the contribution from the public purse ever-diminishing, the need to improve organisational resilience within the Welsh sporting sector has never been more important. We are constantly horizon scanning the sporting landscape to ensure that we can get the best deals and opportunities for our members and respond to their requests for those services that would mean the most to them.

Following robust procurement processes, we have introduced five new partners to help improve the financial sustainability of our members:

Traveleads

Working with more than 50 UK national governing bodies of sport and a multitude of professional sports teams, Traveleads provides support for all travel needs, from multi-stop international tours to domestic train, coach and hotel bookings. Our agreement with them means all WSA members receive the very best discounted and added value airfare deals. They also provide a free travel portal, making it easier to manage team itineraries and finances. With the potential impact of Brexit looming, the visa and travel advice they provide will be immensely valuable to our members when organizing European travel.

Sport:80

Records management is the cornerstone of understanding a business and its audience. Sport:80 is a sophisticated yet easy-to-use sports management system enabling each of our sporting member organisations to manage multiple areas of their business; from membership registrations to event entry and management. The solution enables greater data security and facilitates organisational stability and the streamlining of systems. WSA members receive beneficial rates and we have negotiated a cap on the fees payable so that cost does not become a barrier to accessing the benefits of the system.

Orchard

WSA members are now able to take advantage of a whole suite of innovative services from our new media & events partner, Orchard. A multi-service creative agency, Orchard delivers everything from website design through to large scale event management - taking an integrated approach which can potentially save both time and money. With a proud history of working with sport, the award-winning Orchard team is ideally placed to support our members, and with discounted rates for the whole spectrum of the services, our members are able to access more for less.

Enterprise

The national vehicle-hire firm Enterprise offer WSA members unrivalled rates in terms of daily rental, dedicated vehicles and the virtual car club options. This solution provides an environmentally friendly way of managing transport needs, and with branches and vehicles within 10 miles of more than 93% of the UK population, this presents an excellent service proposition for our membership. Assessable via an online portal, it means that that organisations have complete oversight of transactions, and their keyless digital entry means that vehicles can be available within the hour.

Fundraising

The WSA has paired with Localgiving to offer our members the chance to explore the substantial benefits of online fundraising. Localgiving is a not-for-profit organisation that provides the tools for groups in Wales to raise money through online appeals and by encouraging fundraisers, and have so far supported community organisations in Wales to raise over £500,000 worth of funding.

Resources include supporting members to make online donation pages, as well as helping to promote the work to successfully raise sustainable income. We have negotiated a deal so that WSA members can access a discount of 25% off the Localgiving membership costs.



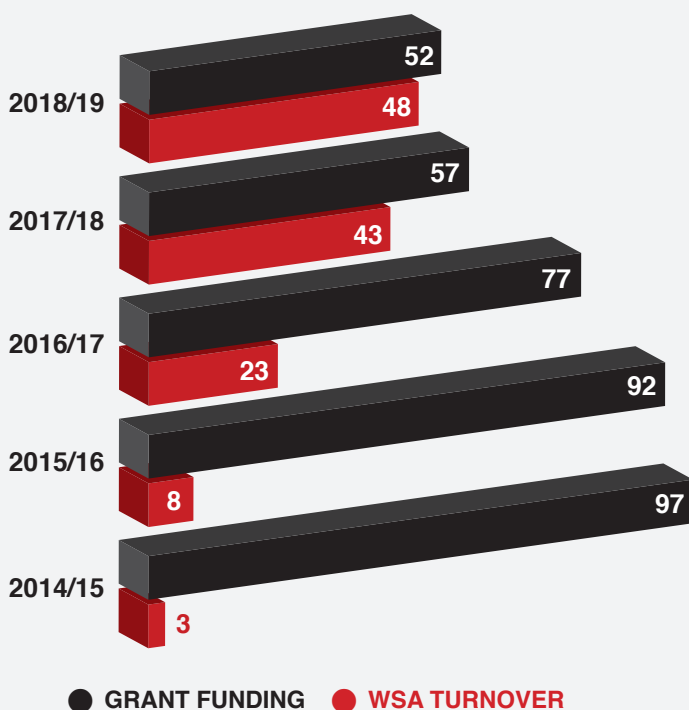
Governance & Finances

Finance Report

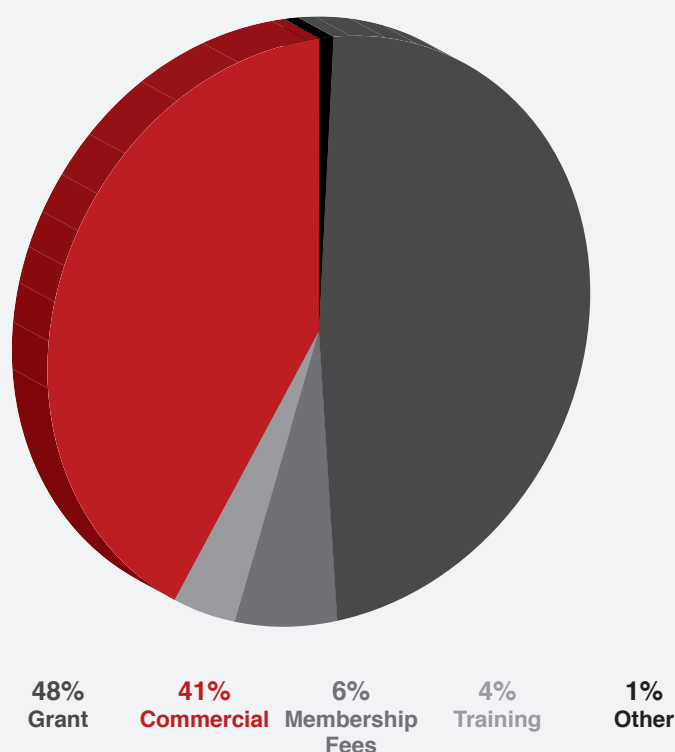
As representatives of the sector, we are committed to leading by example and in diversifying our income streams so that we are a more sustainable organisation. Our not-for-profit status gives us a unique proposition and we have used this to full effect in attracting new partnerships and services for our members.

We have ended this financial year with a surplus and are continuing to reduce our reliance on Sport Wales' grant funding, which is down from 97% in 2015 to 52% this year (including disbursements) - see Graph 1 below. A breakdown of the WSA's turnover can also be found in Graph 2.

The funding we receive from Sport Wales enables us to support members from all corners of the Welsh sporting sector to build their own resilience, and this investment is greatly valued.

Vibrant Nation

To mitigate trading risks and create new opportunities to generate commercial income, the WSA has established a trading arm. The ethos of this social enterprise company, known as Vibrant Nation, is that strength comes from a united force. Its vision is to create a free to access marketplace, across the UK, for not-for-profit organisations to work together to drive down costs, so that more of the money generated can be invested where it matters most. Using the power of the collective to drive shared savings, the company now boasts in excess of 200 clients from all corners of the not-for-profit sector in the UK.

GLFW contract award

Through its trading company Vibrant Nation, the WSA competitively tendered for and won the Sport Wales contract to deliver the Governance and Leadership Framework for Wales programme for 56 beneficiary organisations from across the sporting landscape in Wales.

Among the many strengths of this bid were our ability to understand some of the main challenges and barriers to the development of good governance among the smaller beneficiaries of the programme, and to propose solutions to these. Our skills in identifying the opportunity to use the contractual investment to leverage support from other funded services, not specific to sport, also scored highly in the bid.

We look forward to working with the beneficiaries of the programme in the year ahead to support the continued success of the programme.

Our Priorities for 2019/20

- Strengthening the case for increased investment and support in sector resilience.
- Developing a Welsh Language translation service framework for our members.
- Creating a fundraising platform to help the sector identify funding opportunities from Trusts and Foundations.
- Working with Sport Wales and Higher Education to develop a single national database for insight & evidence supporting the work of the sport sector.
- Refreshing our “Fit for the Future” document as an evidence toolkit for members, and a resource to showcase their work in contributing to wider public policy areas.
- Looking to identify opportunities for our members within the new funding model developed as a result of Sport Wales’ new Strategy.
- Delivering the Governance & Leadership Framework for Wales contract.
- Expanding our training provision to meet member needs, and signposting to relevant opportunities for learning and development.
- Implementing a workshop approach for policy and consultation development.
- Expanding the reach of Vibrant Nation as a vehicle to reduce costs and invest more into WSA member services.

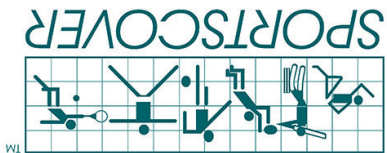

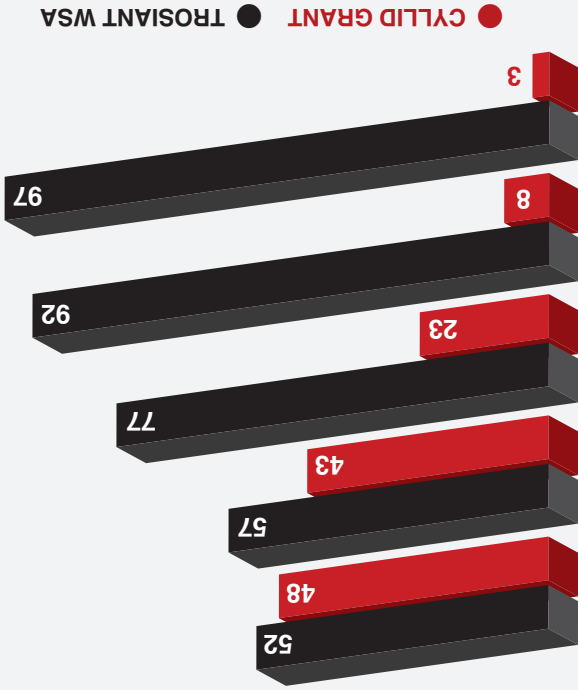


Adroddiad Cyllid

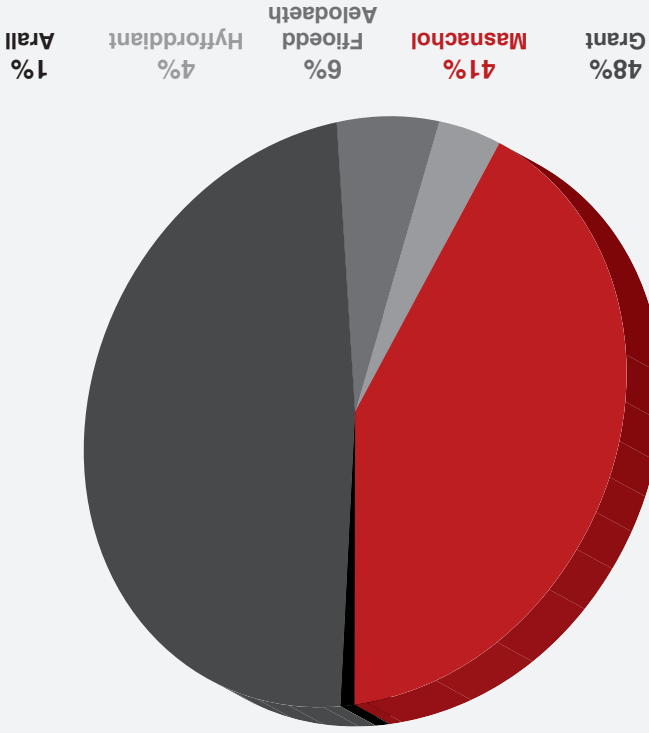

Vibrant Nation

Er mwyn lledtu peryglon masnachu a chreu cyfleoedd newydd i greu incwm masnachol, mae WSA wedi sefydlu canngen fasnachu. Ethos y cwmni menter gymdeithasol hwn, o'r enw Vibrant Nation, yw'r cryfder a geir trwy uno grym. Ei weledigaeth yw creu marchnad y gellir ei defnyddio am ddim, ar draws y DU, i alluogi sefydliadau dielw i gydweithio i leihau costau, er mwyn gallu buddsoddi mwy o'r arian sy'n cael ei greu yn y manau pwysicaf. Mae gan y cwmni, sy'n defnyddio grym ar y cyd i ysgogi arbedion a rennir, bellach dros 200 o gleientiaid o bob cwr o'r sector dielw yn y DU.

Dyfarnu contract GLFW

Trwy ei gwmni masnachu, Vibrant Nation, fe wnaeth WSA gyflwyno tendr cystadleuol am gontract Chwaraeon Cymru i gyflwyno rhaglen Fframwaith Llywodraethu ac Arwain Cymru ar gyfer 56 sefydliad buddiolwyr ar draws tîr wedd chwaraeon Cymru, a'i ennill.

Ymysg cryfderau niferus y cais hwn oedd ein gallu i ddeall rhai o'r prif heriau a'r rhwystrau i ddatblygu llywodraethu da ymysg buddiolwyr llai y rhaglen, a chynnig atebion i'r rhain. Cafodd ein sgiliau yn adnabod cyfleoedd i ddefnyddio buddsoddiad ar gontract i gael cymorth gan wasanaethau eraill sy'n cael eu harannu, nad ydynt yn benodol i chwaraeon, sgôr uchel yn y cais hefyd.

Edrychwch ymlaen at weithio gyda buddiolwyr y rhaglen yn y flwyddyn i ddod i gynnal llwyddiant parhaus y rhaglen.

Datblygu Cadernid Cynaliadwyedd ariannol a sefydliadol

Trosolwg

Gyda'r cyfraniad o bwrs y wlad yn crebachu, mae'r angen i wella cadernid sefydliadol yn sector chwaraeon Cymru mor bwysig ag erioed. Rydym yn edrych tua'r gorwel yn barhaus gyda'r dirwedd chwaraeon er mwyn sicrhau y gallwn gael y cyfundebaru a'r cyfioedd gorau ar gyfer ein haelodau ac ymateb i'w ceisiadau am y gwasanaethau hynny fyddai'n golygu twyaf iddynt.

Yn dilyn prosesau caffael cadarn, rydym wedi cyflwyno pum partner newydd i wella cynaliadwyedd ariannol ein haelodau:

Travelads

Mae Travelads, sydd yn gweithio gyda thros 50 o gyrrff llywodraethu chwaraeon cenedlaethol yn y DU a nifer fawr o dimau chwaraeon profesiynol, yn darparu cymorth ar gyfer pob angen yn ymwneud â theithio, o deithiau rhyngwladol sawl cam i archebu hyfforddiant, coetsis a gwestai domestig. Mae ein cytundeb gyda nhw'n golygu bod pob aelod o WSA yn cael y cynigion awy'r gostyngol a gwerth ychwanegol gorau. Maent hefyd yn darparu porth teithio am ddim, sy'n ei wneud yn haws i reoli manifestos, amserleni a chyllid timau. Gydag effaith bosibl Brexit ar y gorwel, bydd y cynngor y maent yn ei roi ar ffas a theithio yn werthfawr tu hwnt i'n haelodau wrth drefnu teithiau Ewropeaidd.

Sport:80

Rheoli Cofnodion yw congrfffaen deall busnes a'i gynulleidfa. Mae Sport:80 yn system rheoli chwaraeon soffistigedig ond hawdd ei defnyddio sydd yn galluogi pob un o'n haelod-sefydliadau chwaraeon i reoli meysydd lluosog o'u busnes; o gofrestru aelodau i fynediad a rheolaeth digwyddiadau. Mae'r ateb yn galluogi diogelwch data gwell ac yn hwyluso sefydlogrwydd sefydliadol a symleiddio systemau. Mae aelodau WSA yn cael cyfraddau buddiol ac rydym wedi trafod cap ar y ffioedd sy'n daladwy fel nad yw cost yn rhwystri gael mynediad at fuddion y system.

Codi Arian

Mae WSA wedi parhau gyda Localgiving i roi cyfle i'n haelodau archwilio buddion sylweddol codi arian ar-lein. Mae Localgiving yn sefydliad dieiw sydd yn rhoi'r offer i grwpiau yng Nghymru godi arian trwy apeliadau ar-lein a thrwy annog codi arian, a hyd yn hyn mae wedi cynorthwyo sefydliadau cymunedol yng Nghymru i godi dros £500,000. Mae'r adnoddau yn cynnwys cynorthwyo aelodau i greu tudalennau cyfrannu ar-lein, yn ogystal â helpu i hyrwyddo gwaihi i godi incwm cynaliadwy yn llwyddiannus. Rydym wedi trafod cytundeb er mwyn i aelodau WSA allu cael gostyngiad o 25% ar gostau aelodaeth Localgiving.

Enterprise

Mae'r cwmni cenedlaethol llogi cerbydau, Enterprise, yn cynnig cyfraddau digyffelyb i aelodau WSA o ran rhentu dyddiol, cerbydau neilltuo ac opsiynau clwb ceir rhythwir. Mae'r ateb hwn yn cynnig ffordd ecogyfeillgar o reoli angheion trafndiaeth, a chydachanghenau a cherbydau o fewn 10 milltir i fwy na 93% o boblogaeth y DU, mae hwn yn gynnig rhagorol o wasanaeth i'n haelodau. Mae'n hygyrch trwy borth ar-lein, sy'n golygu y gall sefydliadau weld eu trafodion i gyd, ac mae mynediad digidol heb allwedd i'n golygu y gall cerbydau fod ar gael o fewn yr awr.

Orchard

Gall aelodau WSA bellach fanteisio ar gyfres gyfan o wasanaethau arloesol gan ein partner cyfringau a digwyddiadau newydd, Orchard. Mae Orchard, asiantaeth greadigol, aml-wasanaeth, yn darparu popeth o ddylunio gwefannau i reoli digwyddiadau ar raddfa fawr - gydag ymagwedd integredig a allai arbed arian ac arian. Gydag enw da yn gweithio ym myd chwaraeon, mae tim blaenllaw Orchard mewn sefyllfa ddefnyddol i gefnogi ein haelodau, a chydachyfraddau gostyngol i'r sbectwm cyfan o wasanaethau, gall ein haelodau gael mynediad at fwy am lai.

GDPR

Ymunodd WSA â Chynghrair GDPR Cymru i roi cymorth ychwanegol i aelodau i'w helpu ar eu taith i gydymffurfio'n llawn â GDPR. Mae cyfanswm o 178 o gyfranogwyr wedi cael eu hyfforddi ar draws 23 sefydliad aelodau a ddedisodd achub ar y cyflie i gael cymorth trwy WSA. Rydym yn annog bod cydymffurfio â GDPR yn parhau'n ymdrech sefydliadol parhaus er mwyn sicrhau cadernid busnesau i'r dyfodol.

Diogelu

Rydym yn parhau i gynniig yr ehangder o hyfforddiant diogelu yn cynnwys cyrsiau Diogelu ac Amdiffiyn Plant, Adnewyddu Ar-lein ac Amser i Wrando. Rydym wedi gwethio'n benodol gydag uwch arweinydd Diogelu i ddablygu ein templedi ategol, er enghraifft, creu dogfen sydd yn awgrymu'r arfer gorau ar gyfer ymateb i faterion diogelu plant, cwynion neu gyhuddiadau mewn lleoliad chwaraeon.

Catwyd presenoldeb da yn ein symposiwm Llwybr i Gadernid, gyda thros 90 o bobl ar draws y sector yn cymryd rhan mewn sesiynau panel rhyngweithiol gydag arbenigwyr ar draws meysydd codi arian, nodi a datblygu busnes. Gyda'n partner cyfreithiol, Geldards, fe wnaethom hefyd gynnal hyfforddiant ar Stwytthura Cyfreithiol ar gyfer Sefydliadau, a rhoi cyflwyniad yng Nghyngor Gweithredau Gwifodol Cymru ar fuddion sefydliadol ac ariannol gwasanaethau a rennir.

Byrddau

Mae ein partneriaeth gydag Acorn Executive Search yn parhau i ffynnu gyda 23 o'n haelodau wedi defnyddio'r gwasanaeth pro-bono ar gyfer recriwio tua 45 o Gyfarwyddwyr Anweithredol (NED) ar gyfer eu Byrddau perthnasol, a rhai sydd wedi defnyddio'r gwasanaeth gan fod rhai cyffwrddio NED lluosog ac yn cynnwys y gwasanaeth gostyngol, mae cyfanswm yr arbedion i aelodau WSA tua £230,000 ar gyfer y fflyddyn ariannol hon.
