Check list “Phased return to Target Shooting”

Checklist

Welsh Target Shooting Federation has some simple steps for a committee to follow when considering re-opening:

- Step 1. Gain **consensus** on re-opening from the following:
- i. Minuted approval by the Club or Ground Committee
 - ii. Verbal agreement by key club personnel not on the committee (i.e. RO’s, Officials, Staff, Safeguarding/Welfare Officers etc who may not be on the committee but are essential for the return to shooting)
- Step 2. **Read all appropriate guidance**, in particular:

Welsh Target Shooting Federation & Partners
- Step 3. Undertake a **thorough risk assessment** on the facility’s suitability to safely re-open managing the health of all those using the facility. (eg. maintaining the two-metre distancing)
- Step 4. If possible, provide **enough** hand washing or sanitiser, **communicating** to members where this will not be possible and the requirement for them to bring their own.
- Step 5. A **booking system** to avoid contact with more than one other household to ensure social distancing guidelines are maintained. (We appreciate this is a substantial restriction for certain types of shooting and shooting locations.)
- Step 6. Once established, **clearly communicate rules** to members so they are clear what is expected of them on arrival, when shooting, and on completion. This can also include providing signage at the club.

Also Consider:

- i. Notifying the landowner (for clubs that hire or lease the facility)
- ii. Notifying the Local Police Firearms Licensing Department

If you have answered YES to the steps above, then your club may be able to re-open. We encourage you to use the more detailed guidance that will be available from the WTFSF and please contact us (WTFSF) if you require support.
